### **ITINERARY**

#### August 12, 2023 Saturday Arrive in Cairo, Egypt

Arrive in Cairo by your directly booked international airline. Welcome and assistance upon arrival at the arrival lounge of Cairo airport by your local English speaking guide. Later, transfer to your downtown hotel in Cairo.



In the evening, enjoy a night out in Cairo aboard a boat with the sights of illuminated Cairo, delicious dinner and show of Belly dancers, Arabic songs Tanoura show (Turkish dance). Overnight in Cairo

#### August 13 Sunday Cairo

After breakfast, visit the Great Pyramids at Giza - the largest of all the Egyptian pyramids and is one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World built as a tomb for the pharaoh Khufu.



The pyramid once held all the treasures that Khufu would take with him to the afterlife. The massive pyramid is around 455 feet tall. At its base, each side is approximately 755 feet long. It covers an area of over 13 acres and is constructed with around 2.3 million stone blocks. Each of the stone blocks is estimated to weigh over 2000 pounds. It took 20,000 workers and 20 years to build the Great Pyramid. Its

construction began around 2580 BC, shortly after Khufu became pharaoh, and was completed around 2560 BC. Also visit the Great Sphinx to the south of Khafre's pyramid at Giza with the head of a human and a lion's body.

After dinner at a local restaurant, we will visit the Giza Pyramids site once again at night to hear the story of the pyramids through Sound and Light show. With the Sound Light Show at the Giza pyramids, the pharaonic history is being re-told by the sphinx, unraveling the ancient secrets and mysterious tales.



Overnight in Cairo

#### August 14 Monday Cairo - Luxor

After early breakfast, check out from the hotel & transfer to Cairo domestic Airport to board your flight to Luxor.



Arrive Luxor and transfer to your 5 Star rated river cruise ship for four nights cruise on River Nile.

After check in visit the East bank of Luxor including Luxor & Karnak temples. The Karnak Temple is temple complex with its contructions in phases done from 2080–1640 B.C by various Pharoahs. The Luxor temple complex was built by Amenhotep III (1390-52 BC) but completed by Tutankhamun (1336-27 BC) and Horemheb (1323-1295 BC), by Rameses

II (1279-13 BC) and finally added a granite shrine dedicated to Alexander the Great (332-305 BC).

Overnight on board in Luxor.

#### August 15 Tuesday Luxor-Esna-Edfu

After breakfast, visit the West bank of Luxor including Valley of Kings with its many ancient tombs full of art and hieroglyphics including King Tutankhamun's tomb—the most famous tomb in the valley. Visit the temple of Queen Hatshepsut the only Queen who ruled for 20 years at El-Dier El-Bahary & the Colossi of Memnon with its two majestic statues dedicated to King Amenhotep III.

Sail to Esna.

Overnight on board in Edfu.



#### August 16 Wednesday Edfu- Aswan


After breakfast, visit the temple of Horus in Edfu built from 237 – 57 BC was buried under centuries of sand and silt until the nineteenth century, when French Egyptologist Auguste Mariette rediscovered the site.



It is dedicated to the Falcon God, Horus, who was frequently merged with the Greek god Apollo. In fact, the city of Edfu was renamed Apollonopolis Magna during Greco-Roman rule in Egypt. Sail to Kom Ombo. Visit the temple shared by the two Gods Sobek, the Crocodile Goddess & Horus, the Falcon God in Kom Ombo. Temple of Sobek, the crocodile god, is located atop a picturesque bluff alongside the river. Sail to Aswan. Overnight on board in Aswan.

#### August 17 Thursday Aswan- Abu Simbel-Aswan

After early breakfast, drive to Abu Simbel (around 3 hours drive) to visit the temples of Ramses II & Queen Nefertari. The two Temples of Abu Simbel, with their unique style, are considered to be the masterpieces of ancient Egypt. They reflect the glory and grandeur of the new Kingdom. The Temple of Ramses II was dedicated to the four universal gods Ptah, Re-Her-Akhtey, Amun-Re, and to Ramesses II himself. The great Abu Simbel temple is also called The Sun Temple of Ramses II. The Temple of Queen Nefertari is also Called Temple of Hathor who was the wife of the Sun God so in a symbolic way, the two Temples, that of Ramesses II and that of Nefertari, bring Ramesses II, Nefertari, Hathor and the Sun God together as one. Due to construction of Aswan High Dam on Nile river, massive water reservoirs was formed in Lake Nasser which would have submerged the monument of Abu Simbel in water.



UNESCO and Egyptian government started the campaign to save the Abu Simbel monuments in the Nubian region from being flooded by the waters of Lake Nasser. UNESCO and Egyptian Government started this great engineering feat of saving the temples of Abu Simbel by dismantling, stone by stone, in the early 1960s and relocating them to higher grounds. After the tour of Abu Simbel, drive back to Aswan for overnight stay at in your cruise ship. hotel. Overnight on board the cruise ship.

#### August 18 Friday Aswan- Cairo

After early breakfast, check out of the cruise ship and visit the High Dam, the Unfinished Obelisk & Philae temple. You will start your day tour from Aswan High Dam to see one of the twentieth-century miracles. It is of the highest dams near the Nasser Lake.



Later, keep your date with the God Osiris while sailing to the house of the Goddess Isis at Philae Temple. Also visit the largest ancient unfinished obelisk made of pink granite is 42 meters long and is considered the largest obelisk in the world. Later , in the evening, transfer to airport for flight to Cairo. Arrive in Cairo and transfer to hotel.

#### August 19, 2023 Saturday Cairo - Istanbul, Turkey

Arrive in Istanbul. Welcome and assistance upon arrival at the airport by your local English-speaking professional guide. Later transfer to hotel. In the afternoon, visit Grand Bazaar which is one of the World's largest and oldest medieval century Bazaar.



You will visit the New City Taksim District and enjoy the walk through the famous bustling streets of Istanbul.

Overnight in Istanbul.

#### August 20 Sunday Istanbul

After Breakfast, proceed on full Day Tour of Istanbul visiting Blue Mosque, Hippodrome, Topkapi Palace, Hagia Sophia, Grand Bazaar, Taksim District. Topkapi Palace, Which Served as The Palace of The Ottoman Sultans Between the 16th And 19th Centuries. Haghia Sophia (St. Sophia's

Basilica) Built by Constantine the Great and Reconstructed by Justinian in the 6th Century with One of The Biggest Dome in The World.



Blue Mosque (Sultan Ahmet Camii), Famous for Its Six Minarets, Its Beautiful Blue Iznik Tiles, Unique Architecture and Marble Lattice Work. Byzantine Hippodrome, The Center of Byzantine Life For 1000 Years. Overnight in Istanbul.



#### August 21 Monday Istanbul - Cappadocia

After breakfast, check out and transfer to airport for flight to Cappadocia. Arrive and check in at the hotel. In the evening enjoy the swirling dervish Sufi show in a local theatre.

#### **August 22 Tuesday Cappadocia**

Early morning sunrise optional ballon ride over the lunar like landscapes of Cappadocia (subject to weather conditions).



Later in the afternoon, tour of Cappadocia to explore its lunar landscape like surroundings. Visit the Pasabag Valley, with Its Surreal Mushrooming Pinnacles and Avanos, Renowned for Its Handmade Pottery. Visit The Stunning Valley of Goreme and The Open-Air Museum, Where the Remains of Churches and Early Christian Dwellings, hewn from the Rock, dates back to thousands of years.

Begin Your Discovery of Cappadocia with Goreme's "Caves of God", A UNESCO World Heritage Site. Monasteries And Churches Hewn into Volcanic Rock Reached Their Peak Between 7th And 13th Centuries. You Will See the Ongoing Erosion on The Fairy Chimneys of Pasabagi.



Overnight in Cappadocia.

#### August 23 Wednesday Cappadocia – Izmir

After breakfast at the hotel, we check out and transfer to airport for flight to Izmir. Arrive in Izmir and transfer to hotel in Izmir.

Overnight in Kusadasi.

#### August 24 Thursday (Ephesus)-Izmir- Istanbul

After Breakfast, Visit The Premiere Greco-Roman City of The Ancient World, Ephesus. Explore The Temple of Hadrian, The Famous Celsus Library, Great Theatre, Temple of Artemis and Other Roman Sites. Then Visit the House of Virgin Mary and The Impressive Collections at The Ephesus Museum.



Later continue to drive to Izmir airport for flight to Istanbul.



Arrive in Istanbul and transfer to hotel. Overnight in Istanbul.

#### August 25 Friday Istanbul - Tashkent, Uzbekistan

Transfer to airport for flight to Tashkent, Uzbekistan to embark on your SILK ROAD Journey in Central Asia. Welcome by your local English-speaking guide. Transfer to the hotel. In the evening Sightseeing tour around Tashkent. Visit the Eski Juva district, then stroll through the largest market in Uzbekistan, the Tchorsou bazaar and the Kukeldash medersa (rebuilt in 2007).



#### August 26 Saturday Tashkent

After breakfast, enjoy the tour of Tashkent- first discovery of the Uzbek capital with a visit to the Khazrat-i-Imam architectural ensemble (rebuilt in 2007) which includes the Abu-Bakr-al-Kaffal Shanshi mausoleum, the Barak Khan medersa. Continuation of the visits of Tashkent with the discovery of its metro, Soviet heritage, passing by the most beautiful stations like Mustaqilliq, Pakhtacor, Alisher Navoy and Cosmonavtii. Walk on Independence Square, Amir Timour Square and Alisher Navoi Square. Visit of the Abdoul



Kassim medersa which houses craft workshops (woodcarving, lacquered miniatures, ceramics, etc.). Overnight in Tashkent.

#### August 27 Sunday Tashkent- Urgench-Khiva

Transfer to the local airport for flight to Urgench. After, arrival at Urgench airport & short transfer to Khiva (30 km) arrive at your hotel.



In the afternoon, Discover Itchan Kala, the old town surrounded by ramparts. A true city-museum, it is full of perfectly restored monuments that plunge visitors into the heart of the tales of the "Thousand and One Nights". Beginning of visits with the Muhammad Amin Khan medersa and the Kalta minaret, the Koukhna Ark fortress - which includes the Throne Room and the Chancellery -, the Juma mosque, the Mohammed Rakhim medersa of the poet khan, known under the pseudonym of Ferouz. The Khodja Minaret: Dating from 1910, it looks like a lighthouse with its turquoise



and red bands. At 45m high, it is the tallest minaret in the city. This minaret had a religious function (call to prayer), military (for the defense of the city) and served as a landmark for the caravans. The Pahlavon Mohammed Mausoleum: Patron Saint of the city, this mausoleum is the most revered in the city and attracts many pilgrims. Its room is in Persian style and the walls of the room enclosing the sarcophagus showcase breathtaking ceramics for the time. The caravanserai, now transformed into a covered bazaar. The Toshkhouli Palace: This palace was built to be an alternative to the Khounia Ark. This palace contains the most sumptuous interior decoration in the city (earthenware, ceramics, carved wood ...) developed by the best artists of the time. In the afternoon, continue visits to Khiva with the Tach Khaouli, or the "Stone Palace" and its Harem, the

medersa and the Allakouli Khan caravanserai, the Friday Mosque with its 218 carved wooden columns. In the evening, enjoy dinner with Khorezm dances Overnight in Khiva.



#### August 28 Monday Khiva - Bukhara

Transfer to Bukhara. The road goes through the Kyzyl Kum desert and the Amu Darya river, which are the largest in Central Asia. The Kyzylkum Desert, like an oasis of ancient Khorezm, is located among the dunes, keeping the ruins of large cities. Lunch break at one of the roadside cafes. Arrival to Bukhara. Later in the afternoon, walk along the Lyabi Hauz square, the trading domes of the Bukhara bazaar, which have survived to this day from the time of the Great Silk Road.

Overnight in Bukhara.

#### August 29 Tuesday Bukhara

A full day tour of Bukhara - a city of poetry and fairy tales lies in an oasis in the middle of the Kyzyl-Kum desert. It is one of the oldest cities in the world, the history of which is more than 2500 years. Over the centuries, the city has experienced an era of prosperity and decline. Today Bukhara is one of the most important industrial and economic centers, one of the most important cities in Central Asia. As a trading city, Bukhara exists 2000 years and more than 1000 years is the metropolis of skillful architecture. Departure for a complete discovery of this fabulous city, which presents sumptuous monuments over nearly ten centuries including Ismail Samani Mausoleum the oldest mausoleum in Central Asia (9th century). Depending on the time of day, it changes color with the sun; Job Source as its name suggests it is from the well it contains. Legend has it that this mausoleum grants wishes by going around 3 times; the Bolo Khaouz Mosque, and its superb decorated ceiling. Visit Ark or fortress: an ancient royal city was continuously occupied from the 5th century to 1920.



In the past 3000 people lived inside the Ark as well as the then Emir and all his wives. Visit Poy Kalon Square or "big foot": It is the most beautiful and monumental square in the city. On this square are three imposing monuments; The 48m high Kalon minaret and Kalon Mosque with astronomical dimensions (130m long and 80m wide), at the time it could accommodate up to 10,000 people. Continuation of the visit to The Medersa Ouloug Beg, lined with blue earthenware:



The Magoki Attari Mosque, from the 16th century; the Khanaka Located near the Liaby Haouz basin, a place built in 1620 around a basin in the shade of century-old mulberry trees. This place is the green lung of the city and the most relaxing place in town. At the time of its splendor, there were

about a hundred ponds and this is the only one that remains; The Nadir Divanbegi Medersa, originally designed to be a caravanserai.

Overnight in Bukhara

#### August 30 Wednesday: Bukhara- Gijduvan- Samarkand

After breakfast, drive tp Samarkand. En- route, stop at Guijdouvan to visit the famous traditional pottery factory.



Arrive in the late afternoon in Samarkand- the Legendary city of the Silk Road, capital of one of the greatest empires to reign, SAMARKAND will leave you in awe with its medieval charm. Occupied successively by the Greeks, the Arabs, the Mongols and finally by the Russians in 1868, it is especially Timur, builder of an enormous empire of which it was the capital and his grandson Ulug Beg, who made the fame of the city. Seen from the sky, the domes and minarets focus attention and on the ground sublime and disproportionate monuments, create an undeniable magic.

Visit the remains of the giant Ulug Beg observatory, which was used to calculate the position of the stars, and the museum housing magnificent frescoes found at the archaeological site of Afrosiab, the ancient city destroyed by Genghis Khan. Stroll the Afrossiob city at sunset. Overnight in Samarkand.

#### August 31 Thursday Samarkand

After breakfast, continue the city tour of Samarkand. Visit to the Chah I Zinda complex, the most moving site in the city. This necropolis is an avenue of tombs, each one more beautiful than the other. It is one of the oldest buildings in SAMARKAND and an important place of pilgrimage. The monuments house the remains of relatives and favorites of Tamerlane and Ulug Beg. The rich majolica and mosaic facades will delight the eyes and the photographers.



North-east of Samarkand is the Bibi Khanum Mosque, which was to be the largest in Central Asia. Time spared only the portal, two small side buildings and the large central mosque.



Afternoon visit Reghistan. This set of majestic, slightly leaning medersas, whose magnificently proportioned spaces are covered, almost to the point of excess with faience and blue mosaics, is the centerpiece of the city and arguably the most impressive architectural site in Central Asia.

On the west side is the Medersa of Ulug Beg, which was the largest university in Central Asia. Opposite, you will discover the Medersa Cher-Dor and the Medersa Tilla-Kari, built in 1636. The latter is aptly named "covered with gold" for its interior decoration. Continuation of the visits with the most famous monument of SAMARKAND which is at the same time the symbol of the city: the Gour-Emir mausoleum, deformation of "Gouri-Mir" or "tomb of the Emir". Overnight in Samarkand.

#### September 01 Friday Samarkand-Tashkent

Morning visit to the silk carpet factory or you can see all the process of making the carpet. Visit of the grand bazaar of Samarkand 'SIYAB BAZAR'. Here you will find everything you want... traditional clothes, food and souvenirs. Continue your journey back to Tashkent. Arrive and transfer to hotel.



Enjoy farewell dinner and Entertainment show in Tashkent. Overnight in Tashkent.



#### Sep 02 Saturday Tashkent - USA

Transfer to the international airport for flight aboard on your directly booked airline.
